#### **BUDGET 2012-13**

A draft budget for 2012-13 had been circulated to councillors for comment and approval. The budget represents an increase of 3.6% on the current year, which mainly related to the transfer of responsibility for the public conveniences on Thornhill Road from Northumberland County Council and the Queen's Diamond Jubilee celebrations. The increase represents an approximate increase of just over £2 on a band D property per annum. The Town Council unanimously accepted the budget and agreed to levy a precept of £348,347 on the County Council.

#### PROJECTS REPORT

Reports on the West Road easy entrance project and the car parking area at Fox Covert Lane will be submitted to the February meeting. Revised plans for the Memorial Hall project have been received and Councillors were asked to view these and select their preferred option. Additional time for quotes in respect of the bridge redesign had been approved and a report will be submitted to a future Council meeting. There was a potential problem with the soft engineering works proposed on the river bank. The Environment Agency had raised some concerns and it was suggested that a meeting should be held with them to discuss them in more detail. In relation to the street information signs, it was suggested that a double sided sign was required at Broadway which would cost an additional £1,000. This expenditure was approved. It was reported that prices were being sought for the

remedial work to be carried out on the Coates Green path. It was also reported that a meeting was to be held with the County Council in relation to the new Heads of Terms for the proposed skate park land.

### RESIGNATION **OF RICHARD HUTCHINSON**

The Council had received a letter of resignation from Richard Hutchinson, a former Councillor for the West ward of Ponteland. The resignation was due to work and family commitments. The Council expressed their appreciation for all of the hard work and efforts that Richard had put into his role since his election in June 2009. It was agreed that a letter of thanks be sent to Richard. The Clerk reported that she had, in accordance with regulations, advertised the vacancy and she had been informed that a request for an election had been received by the County Council.

### **GRANTS TO LOCAL ORGANISATIONS**

### **Ponteland Cricket Club**

The Council approved a grant of £500 to the Cricket Club towards the provision of a new scoreboard in the existing building at Ponteland Leisure Centre.

### NORTHUMBERLAND

reported that the regeneration proposals were still ongoing and the Ponteland county councillors would be attending a meeting with the Deputy Chief Executive to discuss this issue. He stated that an announcement had been made at the West Area Committee held on 10 January in relation to a commitment to spend £28m on new libraries across Northumberland.

### **Community Chest**

Councillor Veronica Jones referred to the Community Chest which was coming to the end of the financial vear. There had been only one application from Ponteland. There was still some funding left and she urged local organisations to submit applications as soon as possible. The funding would also be available in 2012-13. Organisations in Ponteland were urged to contact the County Council to obtain a form or alternatively visit the website www.northumberland.gov.uk where all the necessary information was available

### **Adult Care budget cuts**

Coun Jones expressed her concern at the proposed savings in the Adult Care budget. Some £7m of savings had been identified and this required careful monitoring to assess the impact on services.

### Shoppers' car park permit

Coun Jones referred to the introduction of a Shoppers Car Park permit which would allow residents of the County to park free in charging car parks at certain off peak hours. Two permits per household would be allowed. There was an annual fee of £15.

### Northumberland **Snow Squad**

A useful document had been received from the County Council in relation to clearing snow and ice. This also included advice from the Government on snow clearance and liabilities. There was also advice for Parish and Town Councils in relation to volunteer snow sauads.

### **Housing Needs Assessment Postal** Survey

It was reported that the County Council would be carrying out a housing needs survey as part of their legal requirement to develop housing and planning policies. This was being carried out by DCA, an independent housing research consultancy. The research would be carried out over the next four months and would involve 18,725 postal surveys being delivered to households in Northumberland starting from January 4. The survey could also be completed

### Decision on Green Belt homes plan expected

A decision on whether to proceed with plans for 6,500 new homes on Green Belt land surrounding Ponteland and Darras Hall will be made by Newcastle City Council later this month.

A special cabinet meeting is being held to consider more than 4,000 responses to its joint One Core Strategy with Gateshead Council.

The strategy sets out where more than 30,000 new homes can be built over the next two decades, with proposed locations including a 350-hectare site called Callerton Park between the A69, A1 and A696 near Callerton, Woolsington, Walbottle and Throckley.

A group has been set up called Newcastle West Green Belt Protection Group to fight the plans and its campaign petition with 5,900 signatures was presented to the Lord Mayor at the council's meeting on January 11.

In last month's Pont News we gave Newcastle city councillor Henri Murison, Cabinet Member for Quality of Life, and opponent Guy Opperman MP platforms to outline their views for and against the plans.

Mr Opperman, Ponteland's MP, said he had had a huge response from Ponteland constituents: "Following our leaflet and the Pont News & Views article on the campaign I have been able to submit hundreds of objections to the ill thought out plans. I want thank you to everyone who has supported our campaign to protect the Green Belt.

"Ridiculously, the consultation process closed on January 4th with no notice to local people, so some residents may not have even had the chance to have their objections counted.

"We are determined to maintain the unique character of Ponteland and Darras Hall - and a big part of that is its rural nature which separates it from West Newcastle. We await to hear this month if they will drop these plans. If they get away with this now, who knows what will be next?"



Other opponents include the Save Gosforth Wildlife Campaign, Save Throckley, Walbottle and Blucher Open Spaces Campaign, Newcastle West Green Belt Protection Campaign, Woolsington Parish Council and Kenton Bank Foot Residents' Association.

The Council says its hands are tied because Government projections indicate the level of

housing required to cater for population growth, while the National Policy Planning Framework has removed the priority given to brownfield sites.

The February cabinet meeting is expected to decide which sites will go forward for further public consultation this summer. This will inform the submission plan which will be subject to a further statutory consultation period before final proposals are submitted to Government in 2013. There will then be a public inquiry before it can be adopted as policy by the Council.

# Affordable housing to be cut in new Northumbria Police HQ revamp plans

A decision on revised plans for a building scheme designed to help fund the modernisation of Northumbria Police's Ponteland headquarters complex is due later this month.

But the level of affordable housing in the scheme is set to be slashed in a move which could spark objections.

Outline permission for plans to build 150 new homes on part of the site were approved almost three years ago on condition that 50% of the new houses were in the affordable bracket – as well as a £700,000 police contribution towards local road, public transport and traffic improvements.

Now Northumbria Police Authority is seeking to reduce the level of affordable homes to be built to 20% because it claims the scheme is not financially viable otherwise. That means the whole planning application – which includes the 150 houses, a new 12,000sq ft office block and an access road – has to be determined all over again.

An application was due to go before Northumberland County Council's West Area Planning Committee on January 18 with a recommendation to approve but it was withdrawn. Northumbria Police Authority property advisor Peter Udall said the application was now expected to be heard at the committee's February 15 meeting.

## Bistro plan rejected for second time

Councillors have rejected controversial plans to open a new bistro in the heart of Ponteland for a second time – against the advice of their own officers.

Northumberland County Council planning officers had recommended approval for the resubmitted plans to turn the former Co-op store and Wine Rack in Bell Villas into a two-storey bar and restaurant.

They said the issues of lack of marketing of the site and loss of retail space which had led to refusal last year – later backed by a Government planning inspector at appeal – had been "comprehensively overcome" following new evidence of advertising activity and the availability of other nearby vacant shops.

But members of the Council's West Area Planning Committee, meeting in Hexham on January 18, rejected the application by six votes to one, saying: "The proposal would result in the loss of existing retail floor space within the Ponteland commercial and business centre for which the applicant has not demonstrated compelling exceptional circumstances."

The plans had generated 19 letters of objection from neighbouring residents from the Ryehaugh Estate and businesses, two petitions signed by 170 people, and objections from Ponteland Town Council, Civic Society and Methodist Church and MP Guy Opperman.





## Kevin and Richard get their teeth into new venture

Father-of-three Richard, who had been with the Kingston Park Dental Practice for 12 years, has a special interest in restorative and implant dentistry. Among his previous posts was a spell as lead dentist on Christmas Island in the Indian Ocean and a teaching post at Newcastle Dental Hospital.

Kevin, who has been a dentist for 20 years, was latterly with the Darras Hall Dental Practice for seven years. The father-of-one leads on implant and cosmetic dentistry as well as dental sedation and general surgery.

They have inherited a healthy practice with over 600 patients but hope to attract new patients from across the Ponteland area and beyond as part of their plans to expand.

Richard explained: "We are embarking on a major programme of investment to reconfigure the practice, creating a new front entrance, larger open plan waiting room and three surgeries with state-of-the-art facilities. We are also introducing new services including high end restorative dentistry, implants and facial aesthetics."

Both dentists are highly qualified. Richard is tutor for the northern region for the Faculty of General Dental Practice, while Kevin is also actively involved with the training and mentoring of younger dentists.

Wishing the new partners luck, Mr Hallam said his former patients were in safe hands: "I would be happy to endorse the new owners of

An appeal to resist Green Belt development plans, shock at the size of a new retirement complex and a call for irresponsible dog owners to be 'shopped' to council officials in this month's letters...

### Green Belt housing plan must be resisted

We should resist Newcastle's attempt to build on Green Belt land as fiercely as possible.

The rights to Green Belt land have been hard fought for by previous generations and the reasons still hold good. These are the lungs for large cities which allow them to breathe, and their loss will be Newcastle's as well as Northumberland's.

Kingston Park, Woolsington, and the Airport buildings and the Badger are almost continuous along the east side of the A696, and the space to the south of the proposed green area is built up solidly to the A1.

Ponteland lies alongside most of Callerton Lane and Throckley is at the end of Ponteland Road. That does not leave very much open land at all.

The high density housing being built by Newcastle City is in my view totally unacceptable, unpleasant visually and socially, and will only build up problems for the future. Go and look at Newcastle Great Park. Bleak narrow streets, with no front gardens, garages in garage blocks behind the three storey terrace houses, and no room for trees or greenery.

We must stand firm and not allow ourselves and our countryside be steamrollered by the tactics of a misguided Authority.

How it ever found its way successfully through the planning process is simply beyond my comprehension as it appears to be inappropriately sited. The 'overbuild' has done little if anything to enhance the appearance of what was once a lovely old rural village.

Following reports of anti social behaviour involving young people playing football in inappropriate places where damage may be caused or nuisance caused to residents, a number of acceptable behaviour agreements were drawn up between youths and their parents, Northumberland County Council, ISOS housing and the police.

Whilst these ABAs have been effective, the agencies involved also want to provide a suitable football facility for young people, especially during the dark nights when grassed pitched are waterlogged and in darkness
