# Fantastic weather attracts record crowds to park party

### Fantastic weather attracted a record number of families to Ponteland's Party in the Park.

The tea tent ran out of cups and the BBQ sold out of burgers as an estimated 3,000 people packed the park on Sunday June 7th.

The Rev Hubert Jicha III from Philadelphia - on a ministerial exchange with Rev Tim Thorpe from Ponteland Methodist Church - opened the event, with the entertainment programme launched by Jill Errington's Dance School.

Other performers included Ponteland Community Band and Darras Hall First School Choir, who supported the family service led by the Vicar of Ponteland Rev Peter Barham.

Ron Wood's Punch and Judy show and an Army display vehicle proved popular new attractions, along with pony rides, a climbing wall, archery, a flight simulator, Kirkley Hall Zoo and an art & crafts tent.

This is the 13th year for the event, which is organised by a Ponteland Churches Together committee comprising St Mary's Church, St Matthew's RC Church, Ponteland Methodist Church and Ponteland United Reformed Church.

Organiser Andy Anderson said: "This was most successful Party in the Park so far. Over 2,400 people paid to get in, so probably over 3,000 people attended as children and stall holders get in free.

"Last year we estimated over 2,500 but this year was bigger. The weather was fantastic.  $\,$ 

The BBQ sold out in spite of the increased number of burgers and the tea tent was as popular as ever and they ran out of cups!

"Darras Hall First School Choir were very good and helped with the family service led by Rev Barham, and Ponteland Community Band gave their usual excellent concert. Thanks to Newcastle International Airport and Ponteland Town Council for their support, to Ponteland Scouts for use of their hut and all people who helped set things up and take them down.

"All the churches very much enjoyed working together to create such a spectacular event."

# Secretary of State decision on Birney Hill imminent

The eagerly awaited decision on the future of Birney Hill is due to be announced by the Secretary of State within the next two weeks.

And for both the developer Lugano Property Group and campaigners opposing its plans for a 280-home scheme on the green belt site neighbouring Darras Hall, it is an anxious wait for the government ruling following January's public inquiry.

The two week hearing, held at Newcastle Falcons rugby club in Kingston Park, was told an award of planning permission would unlock a £10.7m bonanza of community benefits.

They included: £3.6m for off-site affordable housing for rent; £1.63m for a 14,000 sq ft business hub; £1.6m for travel planning and a community bus service; £1.2m for schools and leisure; £1.2m for a community farm; and a £1m community fund. Other benefits highlighted were the provision of 17.9 hectares of open space and 84 'affordable' homes on site.

Both Northumberland County Council, which had refused planning permission, and Ponteland Green Belt Group, which



was representing 1,000 local people fighting to protect the green belt, said the scheme would cause "substantial harm" by inappropriateness, impact on the openness of the green belt and landscape character, and impact on the setting of three listed buildings.

Lugano argued the harm was outweighed by four reasons amounting to 'very special circumstances' – a crisis in housing land supply, need to revitalise the regional economy, development of an exemplar garden suburb designed by world renowned architect Sir Terry Farrell and the very special location of the site.

The inquiry was chaired by planning inspector John Gray, whose recommendation is being considered by the Secretary of State. The decision is due to be announced by July 9.

# Duchess presents Queen's Award to charity

A Northumberland charity with a Ponteland fundraising base has been presented with the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service, the highest award a voluntary group can receive in the UK.

Volunteers from Tynedale Hospice at Home, which has a shop in Merton Road, received a certificate and commemorative crystal from the Duchess of Northumberland at a garden party at Alnwick Castle on June 18th. The charity is supported by nearly 250 volunteers, who undertake driving duties, family support, administration and running its shops to enable people with a life-limiting illness to be cared for in the comfort of their own homes, surrounded by family and friends.

The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service is the highest award a voluntary group can receive in the UK, and is given for outstanding service to the community.

Hospice Director Alison Hands said: "We are thrilled to receive this award as

recognition of the outstanding contribution volunteers make to the work of Tynedale Hospice at Home. I'd like to take this opportunity to say 'thank you' to anyone that has volunteered with the hospice in the past, or is a volunteer today. This award recognises your hard work and dedication to maintaining our services."










### Well known Ponteland photographer Geoff Willey died peacefully at Grange Lea Rest Home in May just a few months short of his 104th birthday.

He had lived here since 1964, establishing a photography business in the village as well as being a founder member of the Ponteland Photographic Society and an early member of the Northumberland Wildlife Trust.

But this was only half his life and, born in Honley near Holmfirth, he was a Yorkshireman to the last.

His passion was the Ryedale Folk Museum at Hutton-le-Hole in North Yorkshire. He was brought up in Scarborough where his father ran a high class grocery store and Geoff delivered the goods in the van but hated the role.

Aged 11 years he was given a Brownie box camera and this started not only his photographic interest but a technical flair. He later built a crystal radio set, followed by a more sophisticated version where he could tune in to other radio hams with his own call sign, then an early television set -

then he built his first motor bike!

Failing his medical for the armed forces, he was taken on by the Ministry of Information based in Newcastle and spent the war years touring remote communities in Northumberland and later in Yorkshire showing propaganda films. His technical skills came in useful when a village hall at Boulmer had no electricity supply.

After the war he trained as a frogman as part of his work for seaweed research, based first at Musselburgh and then Orkney. Next he worked at top secret Spadeadam on the Blue Streak rocket programme and finally at the RVI in Newcastle, all the time taking high quality very technical photographs, sometimes in trying or dangerous conditions. A man of exceptional ability!

In 1964 he married Daphne, a farmer's daughter and long term friend from Yorkshire with whom he shared many interests. Sadly, Daphne developed a

terminal illness and Geoff was her devoted carer till her death.

Geoff retired from the RVI in 1976 and was able to devote his time and energy to the development of the Ryedale Museum. His love of Ryedale developed early when as a young man he would take his dog and camera for long walks over the moors. Not only did he observe and photograph the wildlife, he made many friends who were later involved in this long term project.

He made a photographic record of the museum's progress and went down there to celebrate his 100th birthday. His unique collection of cameras and photographs has been donated to the museum. He even wrote a book, with professional help, titled 'Ryedale in my Heart'. Just one of many achievements.

A memorial service was held in St Mary's Church on Friday June 12th.

### New homes approved for Medburn

## More homes are set to be built in Medburn after an outline proposal was approved, despite objections from neighbouring residents.

Woodruff & Co's application for 15 executive dwellings on a 1.6-hectare green field site north east of Greenrigg was given the go ahead at the Northumberland County Council's strategic planning committee.

The latest bid follows approvals for another 37 homes for the hamlet, to the anger of some locals. There were four letters of objection lodged and Ponteland Town Council was against the plans.

Concerns include the additional harm to the peace and tranquillity

of Medburn, the impact of the road access and 'unsuitable' housing types and density and the fear that there would be insufficient capacity for surface water as a result of the new homes.

One resident wrote: "It would appear that the hamlet of Medburn is being destroyed by stealth."

Northumberland County Council said it had been previously considered that Medburn was not a sustainable settlement for new housing, but two appeal decisions within the hamlet for a total of 19 homes determined that it is not a remote or unsustainable location by virtue of its close proximity and connectivity to Ponteland and its range of services.



# Speeding crackdown after spate of crashes

In the month from May 15th to June 14th we have had 21 crimes recorded for the Ponteland area.

These break down to the following offences:

- One damage to a motor vehicle
- Four thefts from shops
- · One theft from a dwelling
- One possession of cannabis.

Enquiries are ongoing in relation to these offences with arrests having been made where possible.

Please remember to lock your vehicle doors when you leave them parked up. Even if the vehicle is parked on your drive it could still be entered if it's left unlocked.

Several residents on Darras Road have highlighted their concerns regarding road traffic collisions which have occurred on other parts of the road in addition to the junction with Western Way.

These concerns have been passed to the Town Council Highways Committee for their consultation with the County Council with a view to finding a solution. In addition to this police officers and Community Speedwatch volunteers will also target the area to tackle speeding issues.

# New era for emergency care as £75m hospital opens

# Major changes to emergency care in Northumberland have gone live with the opening of a pioneering £75m hospital.

All serious emergencies across Northumberland and North Tyneside will now be dealt with at the new Northumbria Specialist Emergency Care Hospital in Cramlington.

It is the first purpose-built dedicated emergency care hospital in England and will have emergency care consultants on site 24/7, meaning patients will be seen quickly by an expert with senior clinical decision making upon arrival and quick access to tests and scans so treatment can start sooner.

Consultants specialising in a broad range of conditions will also be available every day, speeding up specialist care for patients, maximising chances of survival and a good recovery and helping to save more lives.

Changes have also taken place in emergency care at Hexham, North Tyneside and Wansbeck general hospitals, which have become 24-hour walk-in services providing urgent care for people with less serious conditions. Minor injury units in Alnwick, Berwick, Blyth and Haltwhistle will continue to provide services as they do now.

The Northumbria Specialist Emergency Care Hospital, opened on June 16th, has 210 acute beds in seven speciality wards: surgery; trauma; cardiology; respiratory; elderly care (including stroke); acute medical unit; gastrointestinal.

In addition there is:

- a state-of-the-art emergency department with 36 treatment rooms and four resuscitation bays
- a 14 bed short stay paediatric assessment unit
- an ambulatory care unit to provide care for those who do not need emergency hospital admission
- an 18 bed critical care unit
- a birthing centre with an obstetric-led unit and co-located midwifery-led care with 14 delivery rooms, two birthing pools and 20 en-suite single rooms on the maternity ward

- six operating theatres for emergency and high risk surgery and a dedicated maternity theatre located close to the delivery area
- state-of-the-art diagnostics including four x-ray rooms, two CT scanners, two ultrasound systems, a cardiac catheter lab, an endoscopy room and an MRI scanner.

Medical director of Northumbria
Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust David
Evans said: "Our new model of care is
about getting those patients who are
seriously ill or injured to a place where
the right experts will be there consistently,
round the clock, ready to treat them.
Our general hospitals will also continue
to provide round the clock care at 24
hour walk-in services for the less
serious conditions which often need
urgent attention."

### Tea parlour planned for Darras Hall

## A former Darras Hall carpet shop could be turned into a tea parlour under plans lodged with Northumberland County Council.

Lynsey Caizley has submitted the planning application for a change of use for the vacant retail unit on Broadway, which would be open daily from 8am to 6pm.

Her application states: "The intention is to launch a high quality,

family orientated, tea parlour named Bella & Frannie's Tea Parlour within Darras Hall. The tea parlour will offer high quality blend teas, fresh coffees, fresh milkshakes and smoothies, sweet treats including a range of healthy treats, layer cakes, hot and cold sandwiches, afternoon tea, ice creams etc."

Ponteland Town Council and Ponteland Civic Society have both expressed reservations about a planned outside seating area, saying it must not restrict pedestrian access along the footpath.

It is nice to see there are still some trustworthy people about. Thank you so very much.



The Council approved the wish list for 2015-16. It was noted that in some cases permission from the county council for the projects would be required and possibly consultation with residents. The items agreed were:

It is likely that the work will take approximately eight weeks, following which Ponteland will have a much improved facility. The Town Council apologises for any inconvenience caused by the closure.

### **VEXATIOUS POLICY**

12

The Council had previously discussed a draft policy for dealing with vexatious complainants. This had been deferred pending further work being carried out and a further document had been circulated to the meeting. It was noted that many councils had adopted such a policy. The policy was agreed by the Council subject to some minor amendments.

#### **GRANT APPLICATIONS**

A grant of £500 was approved for funds towards communicating with residents and promoting and encouraging new membership of the organisation following a grant application from Ponteland Community Partnership.

#### PROJECTS REPORT

Councillors were informed that some information regarding land ownership had been received from the Solicitor. It was agreed to consider this report in more detail at the July meeting as there were a number of issues that required further examination by the Council. There would also be additional work to be carried out on the land survey by the Solicitor once this examination had been completed.

#### **ANNUAL AUDIT 2014-15**

The Council considered and approved the Annual Return which must be submitted to the external auditors by July 8th. A copy of the internal auditors report was also considered. He had no issues to draw to the attention of the Council.

## PONTELAND NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN STEERING GROUP

The Town Council agreed in principle to the formation of a small sub group of the Neighbourhood Plan Group who would hold discussions with NCC regarding the core strategy. This was subject to appropriate terms of reference being drawn up and agreed by the Council.

#### **HIGHWAYS WORKING PARTY**

The Highways Working Party had met on May 15th. It was agreed to delegate authority to the Clerk to proceed with the cleaning of the Darras Road bridge at a cost of £200. Further work may be considered once a meeting with the Council's Tree Consultant had been held.

### ENVIRONMENT WORKING PARTY

The Working Party had met on May 26th. The Council agreed to establish a sinking fund and register for tree replacements other than donor trees when it had been necessary to fell a tree although the replacement may not be in the same location. The Council also approved a proposal in principle for an adult fitness area subject to adequate funding being available and a suitable location being agreed. A request for a litter bin at Prestwick Road Ends was agreed with the proviso that the County Council agree to empty it. It was also agreed to monitor usage of the bin.

#### **CEMETERY COMMITTEE**

The Cemetery Committee had met on June 1st. The following changes were agreed: there would no longer be any services offered on a Saturday; actual planting of memorial trees would only take place in the planting season between October and March. Funeral directors who use the facility will be informed.

### NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY COUNCIL

Councillor Dodd reported that he was withdrawn from the Local Development Framework (Core Strategy) Committee at NCC, and that a meeting of the NCC Cabinet to discuss the proposed relocation of County Hall to Ashington was postponed due to land issues.

### Ponteland artist hopes to go global

### A Ponteland artist is hoping to go global after his work started to attract international attention.

Alan Reed is an accomplished watercolour artist who launched his career 30 years ago using the Enterprise Allowance Scheme – guaranteeing him £40 a week income after he set up his business using £1,000 of his own funds following unemployment.

He said: "After discovering my work via the internet, an Italian gentleman, now living in Canada, bought an original that I had painted in Italy. Then another. And has now commissioned me to paint more in Rome. That would never have happened without him discovering my art via the internet."

This year one of Alan's limited edition prints of Grey Street in Newcastle landed him among the finalists for the Best Selling Artist title at the Fine Art Trade Guild. In 2014 he was shortlisted for Artists of the Year by the Artists and Illustrators Magazine.

### Dementia unit plan axed in favour of new homes

Plans to build a dementia care unit on the former Ponteland Care Village site have been axed in favour of nine additional homes.

The development to support people with learning disabilities was constructed on North Road in the late 1980s. In 2010, CARE Ponteland (now operating as Hft) announced it was looking to have much of this area redeveloped as housing.

This would allow investment in new off-site options for the people it supports and enable a specialist dementia care unit to be built on site.

Full planning permission was granted by Northumberland County Council for the unit and 38 dwellings in 2012 and 2013.

Demolition of the existing structures on the site has taken place and construction of the residential element of the Bellway Homes scheme, which includes seven affordable properties, started.

Bellway has now submitted a planning application for an extra six 3-bed homes and three 4-bed homes on the south eastern corner of the site.

In its response to the application, Ponteland Civic Society suggested the whole of the site that had been earmarked for the unit should be given over to the provision of affordable dwellings, adding: "This would certainly be more beneficial, in relation to actual housing need, than simply building more of the same."

### New free service to support carers

A new free service to support carers in Northumberland has been launched.

Serrac (anagram of carers) is a social enterprise based in Ashington which aims to bring together service professionals and carers to address the problems faced when accident or ill health leaves a family member needing care.

There are an estimated 35,000 people in Northumberland looking after others either full or part time and the number is set to grow.

Key Whittaker, business development manager for Serrac, said: "Serrac was set up to provide a way of putting those in need of help in touch with legal, financial and other service professionals who share our social and ethical conscience. We focus our service on the particular needs of carers but it is also free to anyone in Northumberland who may be able to benefit from it."

Serrac's income comes from referral fees from service partners and all of its profits go back into Carers Northumberland, a charity dedicated to improving the lives of carers in the county.

Sharon Spurling, chief executive officer of Carers Northumberland said: "We fully support Serrac and welcome their work in Nortrhumberland in finding solutions to the problems so many of our carers face today."
