Thieves peddling expensive bikes

There have been reports over the last month of burglaries to premises and outbuildings, notably in the outlying Medburn and Stamfordham areas where a number of high value pedal cycles have been stolen.

There have also been reports of thefts of domestic heating oil and also a theft of quad in the rural areas. With this type of acquisitive crime it is likely that a vehicle would be used to enable the transportation of stolen property and persons. Please be vigilant and report suspicious vehicles or activity.

Bike theft

Bikes are one of the most commonly stolen items. Failing to secure them makes them an easy target for thieves. Consider the following tips to secure your bike:

Get a strong lock

A heavy-duty bike lock can make a thief's job more difficult.

Make your mark

Marking your bike with a unique code ensures that Police will be able to trace your bike back if it is stolen and recovered.

Insure it

Check whether your home contents insurance covers your bike. Make sure it covers you for thefts outside the home too. If your bike is particularly valuable you may need to insure it separately.

Out and about

When leaving your cycle in a public area, lock wheels and the

frame of your bike to a cycle stand or other immovable object. Use designated parking areas where possible. Don't park in the same place every day. If bike thieves are stealing to order they are more likely to target you if they know where you will be.

At home

More than half of bikes are stolen from home. Reduce the chances of this happening by storing your bike in a locked shed or garage or place inside the home and secure it to an immovable object. Always keep it out of view. Do not leave it unattended when getting ready to leave the house. It only takes an opportunist thief seconds to grab it and go.

Farmwatch Scheme

Farmers and members of the rural community can join the Northumbria Police Farmwatch scheme. This is a network designed to alert residents to any criminal or suspicious activity, share crime prevention advice and make appeals for information.

By signing up to the scheme, you will be kept informed of crime in your area, receive a monthly news bulletin, crime prevention advice and appeals for information about suspicious people or vehicles. Visit the Northumbria Police website to find out more about the scheme and links to crime prevention advice.

Community Speedwatch

Community Speedwatch Volunteers have been out and about on four occasions over the past month, providing a visible deterrent to speeding motorists. They recorded 72 vehicles speeding, resulting in 56 warning letters sent to registered keepers of vehicles.

Plans for £4m retirement scheme revealed

Plans for a £4m retirement housing scheme to replace Athol House in Ponteland have been submitted for planning approval.

Housing association Karbon Homes has revealed designs by award winning architects JDDK for "high quality new retirement living accommodation for older residents".

The development will provide 34 apartments, with 28 two-bed apartments and six one-bed apartments, compared to the 35 smaller homes in the old building dating from 1980 which the firm said did not meet modern standards - or residents' aspirations. There will be 20 parking spaces.

The architects were asked to provide a development which meets local housing needs and is also in keeping with the development 'grain' of the village, since the site sits just outside the Ponteland conservation area.

Zoey Hawthorne, assistant director of development

delivery for Karbon Homes, said: "We've tried to put forward a development which meets the needs of the local community for high quality, affordable housing for older people.

"We have taken on board comments from the local community and made some adjustments to our original proposals to reflect their views. The building is intended to sit comfortably in this location, retaining mature trees around the site, and not being sited too close to neighbouring properties."

The proposed new development has been designed to occupy a similar footprint to the existing building, but elevated slightly above the current ground floor level to ensure flood safety, given the proximity of the River Pont, and moved slightly further from neighbouring properties to ensure no loss of privacy.

Karbon Homes said all Athol House residents were informed of the redevelopment plans in March 2018 and offered extensive support to ensure they were rehoused satisfactorily, and were appropriately compensated for the disruption of moving house.

The plans have been

submitted to Northumberland County Council. Karbon has the support of Homes England in funding the costs of the project, if approved.









MP joins bridleway celebration



MP Guy Opperman joined volunteers for a celebration of the completion of a project to revamp a Ponteland wildlife corridor.

The final stage in the refurbishment of the bridleway from Callerton Lane to the Airport was the installation of step counts at five points along the two mile route, funded by the Community Foundation's 'Out & About' scheme.

The two-mile long former railway track was built in 1901 and ceased operation in the 1960s. It needed significant reinstatement work as the track had narrowed significantly over time with waterlogged potholes and overgrown vegetation which had drastically reduced accessibility.

Work during the past four years has included litter picks and pruning days, planting of new trees and wildflowers, design of interpretation panels, and reinstatement of hardcore.

The step counts are an aid to general health and part of a health recovery programme which links into Northumberland County Council and NHS Northumberland Clinical Commissioning Group's Joint Health & Wellbeing Strategy 2018-2020.

Latest news from Conteland Town Council

New council housing proposed and pothole league toppers: Northumberland County Council update

County councillor Richard Dodd reported that NCC planned to build 1,000 new council owned homes over the next three years as part of a new housing strategy. He also told councillors that NCC had topped a national list for repairing potholes (the authority filled nearly 70,000 potholes in 2018). Coun Dodd then reported that the temporary play area opened on Callerton Lane at Easter was being well used, and that the construction of the school and leisure complex was ahead of schedule and on budget. Coun Veronica Jones stated that she had attended an event at the bridle path held on May 4th (see article on p8). The final stage of this project was the installation of way markers at each of the educational pedestals along the bridle path route. She also referred to the 'Great Northumberland' and 'Discover our lands' initiatives being promoted by the County Council and urged people to get involved.

Election of Mayor and Deputy Mayor

Coun Alan Varley was re-elected as Mayor and Coun Christine Greenwell was re-elected to the position of Deputy Mayor for 2019-20.

Appointment of councillors

The Council approved the appointment of councillors to committees and working parties and representation on various outside bodies.



First ever North of Tyne mayor elected

The first ever North of Tyne Mayor has been elected.

Voters from Newcastle, Northumberland and North Tyneside chose Labour and Co-operative party member Jamie Driscoll ahead of Conservative Party candidate Charlie Hoult.

He began work as North of Tyne Mayor on Tuesday May 7th, leading the North of Tyne Combined Authority's ambitious plans to create 10,000 jobs over the term of the deal, adding over £1bn in goods and services and levering over £2bn of private sector investment.

It has also meant the transfer of power and investment from central Government to Newcastle, North Tyneside and Northumberland.

Mr Driscoll thanked his campaign team following his victory in his acceptance speech as he promised to deliver on the portfolio he campaigned on over the last six months.

He said he would deliver on housing, a people's bank and addressing the 'climate emergency' among his priorities as he prepares to begin his five years in office, and pledged to work with elected members of all parties, extending 'a hand of friendship to all members from the Tyne to the Tweed'.

Following a second preference count, Mr Driscoll received 76,862 votes, with second-placed Mr Hoult receiving 60,089. The total number of verified votes was 185,695 with a turnout of 32.3%.

Major Keith retires from poppy post

Most of us buy a poppy every November and we wear it proudly. But how many spare a thought for the behind-the-scenes organisation of the Poppy Appeal?

For the past 25 years, Major Keith Hotchkiss has been a familiar face on the streets of Ponteland, selling poppies and chatting to buyers.

Keith and his wife Ann, who live in Heddon, have organised the appeal in Ponteland and surrounding areas over all those years, but they have now stepped down after celebrating their silver poppy anniversary.

Keith said he was called up in 1958 and did two years National Service. He was in the Royal Artillery, Tyneside Scottish, then spent 21 years in the TA.

The people of Ponteland and the Royal British Legion owe Keith and Ann a big thank you for their dedicated work and they will be greatly missed.

Rachel Hardwick, the Legion's Community Fundraiser, said: "Last year's (Ponteland) appeal raised more than £17,000 of vital funds for work of The Royal British Legion. Last year we spent £49.3m on services and support to improve the lives of the Armed Forces community in the UK and in 28 countries worldwide.

The Poppy Appeal is the legion's main way of collecting funds used to provide financial, social and emotional support to the serving and ex-service community and their families.



Darras Hall building society closed

for refurbishment

A Darras Hall building society branch has closed for two months for a refurbishment.

Newcastle Building Society is creating a modern, open plan design at its branch on Broadway as part of an ongoing, £6m investment programme across its entire branch network.

The society said the upgraded branch will provide customers with better access to services, information and advice, as well as improved meeting spaces to discuss all aspects of personal financial planning.

Refurbishment work had originally been due to start at the beginning of 2019, but after Barclays Bank announced that it was going to close its Ponteland branch in January, NBS decided to postpone the work so local residents could retain access to financial services with minimum disruption during the change.

The branch closed on Friday May 17th and is expected to reopen around the middle of July, with a celebration event set to follow in August to mark its official reopening.

NBS is halfway through a programme of upgrading or relocating its entire 28 branch network, with work on refurbishing existing branches or creating new ones due to be completed by the end of the year.

Customer Director Stuart Miller said: "While we were keen to get on with this refurbishment, we felt it made



sense to hold it back at the start of the year to ensure people in Ponteland weren't put to too much sudden inconvenience.

"The feedback we've had from local customers suggests they thought we'd made the right decision, and we're excited to now be getting on with the job.

"The reaction we've had from customers in locations where we've already opened new branches or carried out upgrades to existing offices has been really positive and we're looking forward to sharing the new facilities with customers in Ponteland.


